From the Pastor's Pen

Great Commissionary Family:

Many of us were taught in our youth and young adulthood to keep the world in view. Wise missionary-minded Christians instructed us to pray, budget, live, and witness by thinking more of the world than ourselves. When I do this, and I wish I did it more, my soul endures a collision. On one hand, my soul relishes in the hope that together we can reach the world. On an average day, Southern Baptists alone will win and baptize more than 1,000 new converts. Other biblically defined Christians will do a large work, too. This inspires my hope that we can win the world to Jesus and His love. On the other hand, my soul dreads the reality that we aren't doing nearly enough. Though Southern Baptists and others win and baptize thousands each day, UNICEF estimates that 353,000 babies come into the world each day, too. Some estimate that more than 150,000 die each day. In recent years, Southern Baptists have pulled back on evangelism and have experienced predictable results—fewer people coming to Christ and more people facing eternity without a Savior. International Mission Board baptisms have declined from the 300,000 range to around 100,000. For the first time since 1947, Southern Baptist baptisms are below 300,000.

I should thank God and you profusely, however, because we experienced a significant increase in our baptisms for the September 2015—August 2016 church year. I will not get into all the numbers here, but it is enough to say thank you for supporting evangelism, praying for evangelism, and engaging in evangelism. While I want us to do more and accomplish more for the Lord in the next church year, I must take this moment to thank God and His people for loving lost people enough to expose them to the gospel.

Howard Ramsey of the North American Mission Board before he retired said, "The number of people who come to Jesus is in direct proportion to the number of people we tell about Jesus." Fishermen rely on something similar. The more they cast their baits and lures, and the longer they fish,

Worship & Music Ministry Notes

Words make you think. Music makes you feel. A song makes you feel a thought.

E. Y. "Yip" Harburg

Oscar-winning film composer whose credits include "The Wizard of Oz"

God designed humans to be musical beings. Throughout the millenniums, every culture on earth has included one form of music or another. Perhaps the purest expression of emotion, music accomplishes that which words cannot. It speaks the language of the heart and communicates the deepest longings of the soul.

It is no wonder, then, that God desires music to be lifted up to Him in worship and praise. Indeed, He orders His followers to make music for Him. Twenty six times in Psalms alone do we find the command to "sing." Why is singing so crucial to our connection with God? Because old "Yip" was correct in his statement above. "Words make you think. Music makes you feel. A song makes you feel a thought."

Singing connects the mind with the heart. It is where understanding meets emotion. In our response to all that God is and to what He's done (i.e., our worship), singing involves every part of our being – our hearts, minds, and bodies. No cognitive thought of praise is complete without an emotional connection. Likewise, no emotional feeling could be considered legitimate worship if it were devoid of understanding. And none of it would be possible without the body...

Singing also connects worshipers to each other. The chorus of voices all singing the same word at the same time on the same pitch (more or less...) is a marvelous picture of unity. Whether we're proclaiming the classic line "then sings my soul, my Savior, God to Thee, how great Thou art," or the newest lyrics of praise, we are united in declaring the greatness of our God. We are united in both the feeling and thought of worship.

So, why is it that some people do not sing in a worship gathering? Sometimes, the issue stems from self-consciousness. "I can't sing" is a common yet poor excuse. True, some truly cannot sing (due to illness or accident). But rarely do I hear that excuse from such people. In fact, I know of one man with damaged vocal cords who now whistles during congregational songs at church. He can no longer physically sing, yet his soul still longs to lift up a song of praise. God does not care how well you sing. Indeed, the only command in scripture regarding musical skill was made to those who play instruments (Psalm 33:3). If you can talk, you can sing.

Other people were taught to be stoic. Emotion, to them, is weakness. Yet this teaching is at odds with scripture. Again, we're commanded to sing repeatedly. Still other people refrain from singing because of some reluctance or distraction. Perhaps the song is too old. Or too new. Or it's too cold, or too hot, or maybe there's some unconfessed sin serving as a barrier to the worship of God. No matter the reason, we would do well to remember this: God is always worthy of our song.

My prayer each week is that we might be a church who sings praises with all our hearts, minds, and bodies. May we come humbly, confessing our sin, recognizing our need for His grace, and loudly proclaiming the greatness and majesty of our Lord. And may we fulfill the commands of scripture to sing praises to our King!


